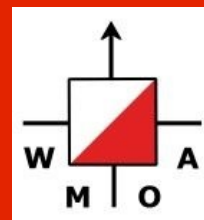

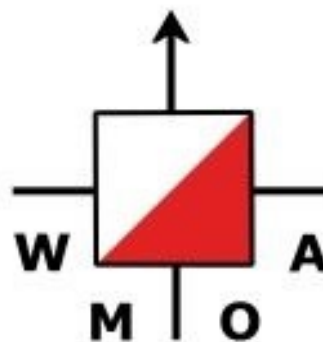

Minutes of WMOA Committee Meeting 12 June 2017 Great Barr Hotel

1. **Present:** R. Collins, B. Elkington, I. Gamlen, H. Morgan, S. Parker, M. White, A. Williams, A. Yeates.
2. **Apologies:** M. Elkington, A. Johnson, D. Kingsbury, R. Lewis, R. Postlethwaite, K. Strain.
3. **Declarations of Interest:** None.
4. **Acceptance of Minutes:** The minutes of the last meeting held on 13 March 2017 as published in the Spring Edition of the 'West Midlander' were accepted as a true record.
5. **Matters Arising:** None.
6. **Correspondence:**

Delia sent Ian correspondence from those unable to attend the meeting. These will appear in the relevant sections of the minutes.

Nathan Lawson (OD) has written to Ray, Ian, and Delia stating that he has recently been selected for JWOC this summer in Finland and had been advised by British Orienteering to pursue any funding opportunities that may be available from both his club and regional association. He inquired about the possibility of there being any assistance that the West Midlands Orienteering Association may be able to offer him with regards funding the cost of the trip. The competition cost for each athlete is £1100. All present congratulated Nathan on being selected and agreed that the WMOA would offer a donation of 15% of the cost of the trip i.e. £165. Ian agreed to write back to Nathan on behalf of the committee to pass on our congratulations and arrange payment of the donation to him.

7. Chairman's Report:

Since our last meeting in March a lot of orienteering has taken place and the bulk of the major championships have been held. The South East held an excellent JK although great distances were travelled between days but the weather was good and kind to us. The North West held the British Long Distance Championships in the Lakes, again the weather was good, as was the event itself. The shorter British Championship races are being held at the end of September near High Wycombe. The WMOA had a few champions and congratulations to them. Next year it is our turn to host the JK and plans are advancing as AY will explain later in item 8a.

It seems that BOF has made or is about to make a number of its staff redundant due to a lack of funding. This does not bode well for our sport in the long run especially if the Chief Executive retires as I have heard he might. If you know of a benevolent millionaire or billionaire have a word in a sympathetic ear on behalf of us all. Luckily, from a selfish point of view, a new Event Co-ordinator has been employed for 2 days a week and is helping with the organising of JK 2018.

8. Treasurer's Report:

Ian Gamlen presented the financial update. The WMJS now has a separate bank account from the WMOA which will be managed by Mel Elkington, WMJS Co-ordinator. As of 01/06/17 the current WMOA funds are £3864.75 and the WMJS funds are £3056.85 giving a combined total of £6921.60. The WMOA funds have been boosted significantly by the successful WOW weekend organised by OD and SinS 2017 organised by HOC and WRE. Thanks to all the clubs involved in organising these. In view of the increased WMOA funds it was agreed that the WMOA will be able to meet its longstanding agreement to donate £1000 to the WMJS each year. Currently £300 has been transferred so Ian will arrange for the remaining £700 to be transferred into the WMJS account in due course.

A brief discussion of the future funding of the WMOA took place. It was generally felt by those present that the WMOA income should continue to be raised via a WM event levy rather than a WM annual membership fee which would be collected on our behalf by BOF as part of the annual membership fee. Ian supported this approach however he pointed out that this arrangement does require the WMOA Treasurer to chase the treasurers of the WM clubs to ensure that the WM levies are paid rather than automatically receive WMOA membership fees via BOF. To ease the workload of the WMOA Treasurer Marian suggested to Ian that he could view the WM event levy returns via the BOF website on a regular basis and use this information to request the appropriate WM event levies.

With regards to the setting of the WMOA budget for 2017-18, Ian proposed that we consider what the purpose of the WMOA is and what we are trying to achieve as well as looking at previous and likely future expenditure in order to determine how large a budget is needed in the next financial year.

9. Fixtures:

Allan Williams reported that a WMOA Fixtures meeting had taken place and there is a full programme of WM League events for 2018 and 3 out of the 4 WM Urban League Events for 2018 are arranged. The next WMOA Fixtures meeting will take place in October/November 2017 following a National Fixtures meeting.

For the Laurie Bradley New Years Day Score Event, it was generally felt that having any 25 scorers rather than certain numbers in certain age classes was satisfactory and simplified the event for the organisers.

a) JK Update:

Andy Yeates updated the WMOA Committee regarding next year's JK which is taking place in the West Midlands. On behalf of the WMOA/JK Organising Committee he has entered into a partnership agreement with BOF in which they have agreed to underwrite the event. Any profit from the event will be split 2/3 BOF and 1/3 WMOA. In the unlikely event that the JK makes a loss this will not be the financial responsibility of the WMOA. The JK accounts will be handled through BOF. Bob Dredge who is currently BOF Treasurer will be the JK 2018 Treasurer.

BOF has appointed Dan Riley as Orienteering Services Officer who will be supporting Andy Yeates as JK Co-ordinator. He works part time and will be working on other major events as well as the JK. Andy has had a productive meeting with him recently.

Andy asked clubs to consider if they have any areas that could be used as a reserve area for the JK Relays. Some discussion took place about possible areas such as Birmingham University which is currently also the reserve area for the Sprint Day. Barry Elkington suggested that Sutton Park was another possible reserve area for the Relays. Andy pointed out that it would give clubs the opportunity to get an area remapped, but the area would need to be embargoed for 9 months prior to JK 2018 taking place.

JK 2018 Publicity:

Andy asked if anyone is going orienteering abroad please contact him so that he can provide you with some publicity materials to take with you to the events. It was suggested that it would be helpful to put some basic information on the JK2018 website early on and direct other websites such as World of Orienteering website to the JK 2018 website to help publicise the event.

JK 2018 Merchandise:

If anyone has any ideas regarding suitable JK 2018 merchandise please let Andy know. It is likely that this will be sourced and sold via the usual traders and the JK will receive some income from it.

Barry pointed out that there is currently no JK Relay Trophy for the M/W210 combined age. He asked that the JK consider funding one.

10. West Midlander:

Rod has nothing specific that he wanted raised in his absence.

11. Website:

Andy Johnson sent his apologies and a report.

12. Development:**Official's Courses:**

Henry Morgan has recently run an Event Safety Course which 9 people attended, mainly from POTO. He is happy to run another Event Safety and Organiser Course and possibly a Level C Planner Course later on this year if there is sufficient demand for these courses. If any clubs would like to take part please let Henry know.

13. Events and Competitions Committee:

Barry stated that the next meeting is due to be held on 24/06/17. He had nothing particular to report back from the last meeting.

14. West Midlands Junior Squad:

Mel and Kirsten sent their apologies and provided the following update for March - June 2017: Two training sessions were held, one at Burton Dassett and one on the Lickey Hills (thanks to HOC & Penny Hemsted).

Fundraising has gone well with £81.91 from Easyfundraising. Please support the squad by using it if you can.

Following Lloyds Bank disrupting the Squad Training on Burton Dassett due to filming an advert there, Nick Bullus wrote to them and as a result the squad received a donation of £55 to add to their funds.

15. Club Round up:

COBOC: COBOC has taken over from OD organising the 51st Sutton Gates Run and Orienteering Event in Sutton Park on 28/06/17. COBOC with the help of OD and HOC are organising the Peter Palmer Junior Night Relays 9-10 Sept 2017 in Sutton Park.

HOC: Marian reported that they are having increasing problems getting access to areas often due to environmental reasons. Organisations such as Natural England are charging large amounts of money to undertake environmental surveys on areas such as Titterstone Clee Hill.

OD: Barry will send to Delia a link to the Government Consultation paper Running Free regarding keeping Park run and Junior Park run free. This has now been circulated to all WMOA Committee members. Please respond by 05/07/17 at the latest.

POTOC: Henry reported that they have just submitted the information required to BOF to renew their Clubmark status.

WCH: Ray reported that WCH are due to be hosting the Compass Sport Cup/Trophy Final in 2018.

WRE: Steve reported they are having similar difficulties with gaining access to areas. They have just started their Summer Evening Events every Tuesday night.

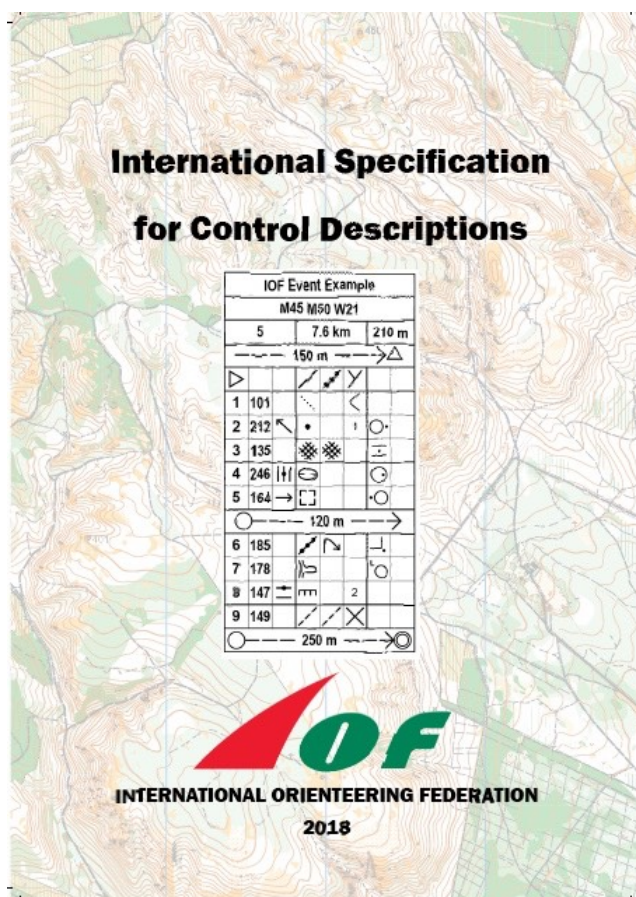

IOF Control Descriptions

The Final Draft version of the revised IOF Control Descriptions has now been published.

There is one significant change in the revised document. From Australia came a proposal to change the control descriptions for boulder, boulder cluster and dot knoll, and to more closely align these with their symbols in the ISOM mapping standard, the rationale being that this simplifies understanding for beginners in our sport. Initial feedback on the proposed changes was largely positive, and the transition for those already familiar with the control descriptions should be relatively quick.

Major Changes to the 2004 version:

1. Optional extra line showing the distance to the start triangle from the timed start.
2. New symbols introduced for Trench, Out of Bounds Area.
3. Changed symbols for Boulder, Boulder Cluster, Dot Knoll.
4. Bend moved from Column G to Column F.
5. Removal of symbol for Radio or TV control.
6. Names and descriptions brought into line with the ISOM 2017 terminology where appropriate.
7. Renumbering of symbols to cater for additions and deletions.
8. A number of minor changes throughout the text in order to provide further clarification as to the use of specific symbols and also include a new symbol for Out of Bounds area (flower bed or similar) which is useful primarily for Sprint orienteering.

The IOF Rules Commission is now looking for feedback on the Final Draft document by August 15 2017. The intention is to put the finished version to IOF Council for decision at their meeting on 13-14 October 2017. Providing they are approved, they will then be published immediately and will come into effect on 1 January 2018.

It is assumed that when the specification is ratified then the course planning software, i.e. CONDES, Purple Pen and OCAD, will issue updates to incorporate the changes.

Springtime in Shropshire 2017

The 17th edition of Springtime in Shropshire was held over the Spring Bank Holiday weekend and was, once again, very successful.

Day 1 was organised by HOC using the Long Mynd and suffered a little with the weather. The mist came down for a while and the temperature was several degrees lower than in Church Stretton just a couple of hundred metres lower.

Day 2 nearly didn't happen because of a last minute withdrawal of permission by the landowner but was rescued by WRE thanks to the generosity of MWOC who offered the use of their area, Nash Woods. By all accounts the courses were 'challenging'.

Day 3 was held on the perennial favourite, Brampton Bryan which has now been used seven times for SinS - the first being in 1985.

Although the weekend went well it did raise the question of how long it can continue in its present format. Spring Bank Holiday is not the best time for a forest event in the Midlands due to undergrowth problems so it is difficult to find suitable areas. Permissions, too, are becoming increasingly difficult to obtain for a variety of reasons.

It begs the question how long can it continue to offer three Level B events? Should a 'winning formula' be changed? I think, unfortunately, the answer might ultimately be forced upon us. Now could be the time to reassess the formula - could the weekend consist of a Sprint (or Urban), a Middle and a Long Distance? This approach seemed to work well at the 'Tamar Triple' held in Cornwall and Devon on the Spring Bank Holiday in 2016 and is common at weekend events on the continent. Perhaps it could be considered by the organisers of SinS 2019?
